Organic Cotton Summit 2021 Pushing Past the 1%

As the global organic cotton platform, OCA is on a mission to unleash organic cotton's potential for positive impact – from field to fashion. We're creating a transparent, responsible, and resilient organic cotton supply chain that prioritises delivering farmer prosperity and meeting the sector's shared sustainability goals. As an accelerator, we want to get to this future, faster.

Evolving how things are done requires collective action and the Organic Cotton Summit is an opportunity for the sector to discuss how we can challenge 'business as usual', increase global organic cotton supply, empower farmers, and provide a roadmap for systemic change. This is a fantastic opportunity for change agents to meet and be inspired by likeminded peers who are committed to reinventing the cotton industry for good.

This year's two-day Summit will be hosted virtually and will tackle the urgent theme of 'Pushing Past the 1%'.

Less than 1% of the cotton currently grown worldwide is certified organic, a disheartening statistic when you believe as we do that organic cotton is the key to transforming the sustainable textiles sector. Organic cotton should be at the helm of driving change in the textile industry due to its potential to address the critical social and environmental crises of our time.

But what decisive actions are required to meet the ambition of pushing past 1%? How can we ensure farmers receive the equity they deserve as the sector accelerates supply? What role does each actor in the value chain play? What investments are required and what systems should we support? And most importantly, what can we learn from others?

We can only achieve meaningful change by taking collective action, so join us and share your insights in the sessions as we address these key questions in the Summit.





DAY ONE Monday November 8 **Planet, People, Prosperity: The Organic Cotton Effect**

12:00 CET | 16:30 IST: Welcome Address | Keith Tyrell (10mins)

Keith Tyrell is the Chair of OCA's Board of Trustees. He is also the Director of PAN UK - an international NGO operating in the UK and more than a dozen LMIC countries. PAN UK conducts research into the health and environmental impacts of pesticides and develops policy options to reduce reliance on chemical pest control. Their field programmes provide direct support to thousands of smallholder farmers in Africa and conduct cutting edge R&D into appropriate technologies to manage pests and increase productivity and engage with actors in global commodity value chains to drive demand for sustainably produced crops and to promote best practice.

Keith has over 20 years' environmental experience. Prior to PAN UK, he was the Director of Programmes and Research at the Koru Foundation – a charity that supports community scale renewable energy projects in the developing world. He holds a Doctorate in Development Studies, and MA in Environment Development and Policy from the University of Sussex – both of which involved research into pesticide use.

Paul Holmbeck stepped down from his role as director in Organic Denmark last year after 25 years at the organization where he played a leading role in creating Denmark's ambitious organic policies, and the market strategies that have made Denmark a world leader in organic sales. Paul is now director of Holmbeck EcoConsult, where he advises leaders in government, business and NGOs on climate and organic policy and organic market development around the world. In September, Paul was elected to the IFOAM – Organics International World Board.
